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## MULTIRESISTANT MRSA NEWLY CONFIRMED: 10-16 July 2004

### HEALTHCARE FACILITY

- Auckland City Hospital: 7 patients: 4 with AKh4 MRSA, including 1 in Ward 67, Medical & Dermatology;  
2 with WR/AK1 strain;  
1 with EMRSA-15 strain.
- Middlemore Hospital: 1 patient with EMRSA-15 strain.
- National Women's Hospital: 1 patient with EMRSA-15 strain, post-discharge from Auckland City Hospital.
- North Shore Hospital: 3 patients: 2 with EMRSA-15 strain, including 1 emergency department patient, post-discharge from Middlemore Hospital;  
1 post-discharge from Ward 8, Surgical, with AKh4 MRSA.
- Waitakere Hospital: 1 patient with EMRSA-15 strain, transferred from North Shore Hospital.
- Auckland healthcare facilities †: 8 patients: 5 with EMRSA-15 strain;  
1 with AKh4 MRSA;  
1 with WR/AK1 strain.
- Waikato Hospital: 2 staff with EMRSA-15.
- Hawkes Bay Hospital: 1 patient with EMRSA-15 strain.
- Hutt Hospital: 1 patient with AKh4 MRSA, who is a resident of Stokeswood Rest Home, Lower Hutt.

### HEALTHCARE FACILITY (but patient in isolation from time of admission)

- Hutt Hospital: 1 patient.
- Kenepuru Hospital: 1 patient.

### COMMUNITY

- Auckland: 8 people: 4 with AKh4 MRSA;  
2 with EMRSA-15 strain;  
1 with multiresistant WSPP1 MRSA.
- Taranaki: 1 person with EMRSA-15 strain, post-discharge from Taranaki Base Hospital.
- Wellington: 1 person with AKh4 MRSA.
- Otago: 1 person with EMRSA-15 strain.

## CURRENT OUTBREAKS OF NON-MULTIRESISTANT MRSA

Non-multiresistant EMRSA-15 (ciprofloxacin-resistant, erythromycin-susceptible) were newly isolated from 1 patient in Middlemore Hospital; 1 Christchurch Hospital outpatient clinic patient; 1 patient in isolation in Rotorua Hospital; 2 Auckland community patients; and 1 pre-employment screen of a healthcare worker from the United Kingdom.

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
